Distribution of end of life care needs across north east Essex

End of life care needs are not distributed evenly across north east Essex. Opposite are figures relating to numbers of deaths across our locality.

There are new palliative care community nursing roles being launched in Tendring to offer increased staffing resource to address this increased need on the coast.

Hospice admissions in a crisis

Please consider discussing any complex or urgent referrals to the hospice inpatient unit with the hospice medical team via Singlepoint or consultant connect.

Whilst we are happy to receive referrals by the usual route; we may be able to expedite a referral, help with a plan for the interim period whilst awaiting admission; or suggest alternatives where admission is not possible or not appropriate. In the past this has included same day admissions and diverting ambulances, who would have otherwise taken the patient to the acute hospital, where this meets the patients need and we have capacity.

My Care Choices Access Equality Project

This is an initiative aimed at improving equality of access to the My Care Choices register. I assist medical staff working in areas of deprivation, by meeting with their patients to listen to what matters to them and their preferences for care. If there is anything they need to improve their quality of life, I refer them to one of our EOL social prescribers to help them access practical, social or emotional support.

The project has been met with great enthusiasm from PCN and care home staff who are keen to give their patients access to the register, but lack the time necessary time for these conversations. It has also been well received by patients who have appreciated the opportunity to talk about their lives and hopes for the future. The project currently runs until the end of March.

Anticipatory Prescribing at the End of Life

Access to anticipatory prescribing at the end of life varies across the area with Colte WCW and Clacton PCN having the highest levels of prescribing across north east Essex. Where people have anticipatory prescribing in place, emergency admissions to hospital are lower. Please consider these medications for people who are RAG coded amber and when they are in place please record this on the My Care Choices Register:
